



WORLD OF MATHS

The Pre K – 6 students all participated in an engaging, hands-on Maths workshop that boosted their problem-solving and Mathematical skills.Students worked in small groups, helping to take any anxiety out of Maths, by working together and achieving wonders! The engaging presenter, Nick, ran the sessions in our school hall, guiding students to analyse various mathematical problems through investigation, comparison and reflection.

The activities focused on real life problem solving and explored various Mathematical strands, such as: data, numerical patterns, measurement, counting numbers, mazes, space, calculation, probability, graphs, statistics, logical thinking, trial and error, eliminating possibilities and logical deduction.

All the students had fun learning through tasks that promoted their sense of curiosity and amazement for the world they live in.





EXTENSION-This term Year 3-6 Extension students of all grades have been working on Narrative Writing. Students have written creative and inspiring stories and have explored a plethora ofways to incorporate more engaging creative writing techniques in their writing. They have been using visual and literary prompts and explored writing across varied genres. Students have enjoyed been giving feedback to their peers through Padlet and Teams. All Extension students will be participating in the Red Room Poetry Competition soon.

DEBATING- The Friday Afternoon Debating Tournament has continued with our students debating Newington College and Trinity College this term. The topics include : the importance of cooking, staying in the shade versus wearing sunscreen and whether school assemblies should be banned. Our teams have become confident speakers while producing excellent rebuttals.

The boys were also impressive only narrowly missing out on the finals!




MANAL ROSTOM VISIT
