


# KINDERGARTEN

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# YEAR 1

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

As their lower primary years come to an end, Year 2 have been learning to use 'big' words such as hefting, predicting, and matter, whilst exploring the concept of Mass.


In preparation for their transition into upper primary, students have been working closely together, discussing and collaborating within their groups. Such skills will be utilised more over the coming years.

One of the most fundamental things that goes on in our Support lessons is "talk". In fact, I think it's an educator's most valuable pedagogical tool. Learning in lessons hinges on meaning making, and making meaning relates to interaction through talk (listening, speaking, responding) encountered in lessons. Questions are what steer and drive our lessons. We have been trying to explicitly dig deeper in our discussions, to add on and build thinking, through suggesting alternatives and posing all types of questions, including open-ended ones, Ito extend or challenge a previous point. We have improved our active listening skills and the ability to reflect on what we have heard. As a result, most students have further developed their awareness and ability to act on feedback they've been given through these talk interactions. Mr Puglisi




#### **ARABIC**
