We love spending our time for the sake of others and Allah (swt). This term we took the time out to set up a charity service stall where all funds were donated to our selected charity.




RAMADAN














What an exciting start to the year! We had a blast testing our patience and teamwork out on the water during our Wellbeing Day and getting to know each other even better through archery tag.

CHARITY SERVICE








Charity Service is a student led initiative where students can raise funds for a charity of their choice locally or around the world. It teaches empathy and encourages students to make a difference in the lives of others.
